Managing Health and Social Care Staff with symptoms of a respiratory infection, or a positive COVID-19 test	On the 14/09/2022 <u>DL (2022) 32</u> was published. It provides updated guidance for Health and Social Care (HSC) staff who develop symptoms of respiratory infection; those with a positive test for COVID-19; and those who have a household member or overnight contact who has tested positive for COVID-19. COVID-19 Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) Guidance (including PPE)	On the 31/03/2022 <u>guidance</u> was issued to all HSC staff on the de-escalation of COVID-19 infection prevention and control (IPC) measures to alleviate system pressures. Testing	Scottish Government has announced the pause to asymptomatic staff testing in Health and Social Care. This change will officially commence on the 28/09/2022 but earlier moves are to be encouraged. 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Coronavirus (COVID-19) advice for people at the highest risk (previously the 'shielding list')	The Highest Risk List (HRL) ended on the 31/05/2022. <u>Advice</u> is available for those who were on the HRL which covers staying safe at work, financial support, vaccinations and other key topics.
Homeworking	Further to <u>DL (2021) 05</u> and <u>DL(2021) 07</u> that referred to the Stay at Home Regulations, as of 31 January 2022 <u>Scotland's work from home guidance has been</u> <u>relaxed</u> . The Scottish Government have updated their information about working from home and published <u>hybrid working guidance</u> .
	The Scottish Government encourages employers to consider the implementation of a hybrid approach to working – with workers spending some time in the office and some time at home where that can be done safely.
Safer workplaces & managing staff concerns when returning to work	<u>Guidance</u> on safer workplaces and public settings has been published. This guidance includes information on risk assessments, ventilation, vaccinations, testing, hybrid working and more.
	We would encourage all staff who have concerns over their safety at work due to their pregnancy, underlying health conditions, ethnicity or any other factors to refer to this guidance.
	If a member of staff remains concerned over their safety at work, we would advise managers to have sensitive, supportive conversations with staff that consider their health, safety, physical and psychological wellbeing, as well as personal views/concerns about risks. Wellbeing support services should also be promoted to staff.
